## Park(ing) Day Guide

## **Step 1: Determine Location**

- Successful Park(ing) Day locations are typically: near restaurants, business districts, areas with a lot of foot traffic, very visible to the public, streets with less traffic, streets with lower speed limits, etc
- Examples of Potential Street/Areas for Park(ing) Day Demonstrations
  - Cherokee Street
  - The Grove
  - Central West End (Euclid Ave)
- Old North
- South Grand Business District
- Washington Ave (Downtown St. Louis)
- Avoid streets with high traffic and cars traveling at high speeds
  - o Gravois, Grand, Kingshighway, Hampton, Chippewa, Natural Bridge, etc.

### Step 2: Develop a Site Plan

 All Park(ing) Day applicants are required to develop a site plan, which is a basic drawing/design of your proposed Park(ing) Day parklet demonstration. The site plan will be submitted along with your online application <u>Click here to view an example!</u>

#### • Your site plan should include:

- The width and depth of your parklet
- The materials you will use for the parklet
- The set-up and tear down time for the demonstration
- A brief description of any potential activities you may possibly do
- The Parking Zone and Space number you'll be using









# Park(ing) Day Guide

## Step 3: Fill Out Online Application

- If you are applying for a Park(ing) Day Parklet in a *metered parking spot*, simply fill out the <u>Treasurer's Office Application</u>
- If you are applying for a Park(ing) Day Parklet in a parking spot without a meter, you will need to fill out a Board of Public Service (BPS) **Blocking Right of Way Permit**

### Step 4: Secure Materials & Demonstration Tips

- On the day before Park(ing) Day participants will need to put a bag over their noted parking meter. This will keep people from parking their cars in your noted parking space.
- To ensure a successful demonstration, at least one person should be present in the parklet at all times
